Letter From the Immediate Past President



When I first took office for the 2014 term, I identified three areas where I would be focusing my energy, and that of the Board:

1) implement a succession planning process that would allow for smooth transitions for every office; 2) establish a sustainable fund-raising process that would eliminate the financial risk of a serious December weather event; 3) improve the diversity levels within the membership. All of these seemed to be multi-year initiatives, and certainly are! SUCCESSION PLANNING: Regarding the succession planning issue, the Board reviewed, modified and accepted a proposed plan that would establish partnerships' between each of the members of the Executive Team and the at-large

members. Plans were put in place for a mentor-ship approach to running each team to provide the learning environment for the 'next gen' of leaders. FUND RAISING: Helping us in this is our 'outside the Board' advisor as part of the Society's 'Open Board' program. We implemented an online crowd-funding campaign in March of 2014, and developed a presentation that we could put in front of potential supporters to explain who we are, what we do and why we need their financial support. Through the GiveSTL Day program, the citywide coordination of efforts for all nonprofits that want to participate, we did establish another group of contributors. Our current plan is to look at the possibility of holding a gala fund-raising event along the lines of similar such events as held by the Bach Society and many other local nonprofits. DIVERSITY: We've improved the level of diversity in the chorus a lbeit modestly. With every new member, our network increases, and this will become more than a metric for us, it will become part of who we are. Being part of the Ambassadors of Harmony is wonderful in many ways, and it is our imperative to keep those ways vital and growing.

This is our self-sustenance program.

Chorus History



HEARTLAND OF

HARMONY

The chapter was founded in 1963, when a call went forth with the colorful introductory statement: "Calling all bathtub baritones." The first meeting of the new Daniel Boone Chorus occurred January 22, 1963. The chorus began to compete in the annual Central States District Chorus Contest, typically finishing toward the bottom of the list, placing tenth in 1972, eleventh in 1973, ninth in 1975, and eleventh again in 1978 and 1979. The eleventh place finish in 1979 was last place. In 1981 a mathematics professor from Washington University in St. Louis, joined the chorus, became its director, and immediately began making changes. Jim Henry described what happened as a result: "Then something

incredible happened that changed everything. It stirred us like a tornado. Its name was David Wright".

David came to us with a vision that the Daniel Boone Chorus could actually become a great singing ensemble, and immediately began to raise the level of expectations.

Within two years the chorus had grown to seventy members.

The change showed immediate results in 1982, with a second place finish in the district contest. In 1989, the

Daniel Boone Chorus made its International Barbershop Chorus Competition debut in Kansas City, Missouri, with seventy-seven men on the risers and finished in sixth place. Wright handed the directorship to Jim Henry in 1990. The Chorus re-branded itself

The Ambassadors of Harmony in 1991, and continued its march to excellence, placing 4th at the international contest in 1994.

The rest is history.


Who We Are

AOH strives for musical excellence and promotes the barbershop style, and has done so by winning a gold medal three times at the Barbershop Harmony Society's international contest. AOH has sung for audiences throughout the United States and performed in England, Germany, Ireland, Sweden, and the Netherlands. The chorus represents the St. Charles, MO, chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society. Today, AOH puts on numerous shows per year including a popular holiday concert that fills Touhill Performing Arts Center in St.Louis each year.



Community Outreach

The Ambassadors of Harmony chorus has worked hard over the years to engage youth singers in the craft of a cappella. The chorus has hosted numerous events for students throughout the St. Louis region with the mission of educating and inspiring newcomers to a capella singing in the barbershop style. Acappellooza Fall is a two-day, annual program at the University of Missouri-St. Louis--one for boys, the other for girls—that has consistently drawn more than 1,000 students per year from dozens of high schools in the St. Louis area. Acappellooza Summer is an overnight camp for four days in the Summer at UMSL that AOH helps to staff and we also perform at the concert with the kids. Another program is a mentoring effort for teenage boys who want to sing in a quartet--we send out a coach to their school to mentor them and provide sheet music—that's Project Harmony. New for 2016 is AcaFest which will be an annual harmony festival in late October as a Saturday performance experience for high-schoolers.




