

Ambassadors of Harmony ANNUAL REPORT



The Ambassadors of Harmony® (AOH) is the Saint Louis area's premier men's a cappella chorus of more than 100 voices known for powerful and musically masterful performances. Its repertoire includes Broadway classics, barbershop, jazz, pop, and a wide selection of holiday favorites.

AOH earned its fourth gold medal at the Barbershop Harmony Society's July 2016 international contest in Nashville. AOH has sung for audiences across the United States and has also performed in England, Germany, Ireland, the Netherlands, and Sweden.

The chorus represents the Saint Charles, MO, chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society. It was founded in 1963 in Saint Charles as the Daniel Boone Chorus.

As the chorus improved and began winning competitions, it rebranded itself in 1991 as the Ambassadors of Harmony.

Since then, the chorus has won dozens of competitions hosted by the Barbershop Harmony Society. Today, AOH puts on numerous shows including a popular holiday concert that fills the Touhill Performing Arts Center in Saint Louis each year.

The Ambassadors of Harmony chorus seeks to change the lives of audiences worldwide through artistic and emotionally-driven a cappella performances. AOH also strives for musical excellence and to promote the barbershop style.

As is true for all Arts organizations, 2021 provided several unique challenges. However, not to be beaten by world events, The Ambassadors of Harmony persevered. The pandemic proved to be a mighty foe, but thanks to technology, ingenuity and a lot of hard work, our organization found ways to reunite, rehearse and, eventually, deliver our first live performances in nearly two years.

While quarantined, we were able to use technology to conduct online rehearsals, providing our artists opportunities to sing, learn and just escape. As the weather improved, we brought teams together to rehearse in cars, outdoors and eventually as a chorus.

The pandemic receded a bit in late summer and we moved our rehearsals indoors, following all the appropriate guidelines for safety and we found a way to plan and deliver our holiday shows. While attendance was low, the shows were a hit and the morale of our organization was lifted.

The past couple of years have been financially difficult for all arts organizations, and The Ambassadors of Harmony is no exception. We've had to make difficult decisions along the way, but we remain cautiously optimistic in our goals for 2022.

MESSAGE FROM The directors

We are pleased that the **Ambassadors of Harmony** weathered the second consecutive year marred by the Covid pandemic. In a time when many choral groups, barbershop and other, simply closed up shop, our desire to maintain our community and to keep singing even under less-than-optimal circumstances propelled us forward. The desire of our members to sing was reflected in the various ways we found to hear our voices. After the previous year of mostly Zoom meetings, where singing as an ensemble is impossible, we used Jamulus, a program that allows us to hear each other. Our tech gurus then found a way to use this concurrently with Zoom (we dubbed it Zamulus) enabling us to see each other while singing together, hindered somewhat by Zoom's latency.

As spring approached we commenced with drive-in rehearsals, whereby each member sat in his car with a microphone and the ensemble sound was transmitted via radio signal. This required quite a bit of equipment and time for setting up and disassembling. As weather permitted we began rehearsing outside, masked, then moved inside with the requirement that singers be vaccinated. As the pandemic subsided in the summer we took off the masks, but when it came roaring back with the delta variant we put them back on. We were the invited guests on the virtual show of the Coronet Club, the Sweet Adelines association of quartet Queens of Harmony. For this we edited together a number of epic past gold and silver medal performances.

To add a current touch to this we learned "The Impossible Dream" and video recorded the chorus singing it live at the Lee Theater in the Touhill Performing Arts Center, and this recording was included in the Coronet Club performance. We also learned our parts to an eightpart piece called "Happy Medley", arranged by former AOHer Adam Bock, which was assembled as a virtual choir with the Oueens. On top of that a small group of Ambassadors consisting of music team members and a few others and a small group of Queens learned and recorded "I've Never Been In Love Before", from Guvs and Dolls, and this too became a virtual choir performance for the show.

The crowning achievement for 2021 was the revival of our holiday show, Sounds of the Season, which had been cancelled in 2020 (for the first time since the 1980s). With some trepidation about putting on a show in Covid times,

we decided to go forward, with protocols for both singers and audience. With a magnificent script by Adam Jurotich and a plethora of music to learn or relearn, we pulled off a successful event, singing five performances and selling some 4000 tickets. Amazingly, during the pandemic, ten new singers auditioned and joined the Ambassadors, all of whom learned the mountain of music performed on the holiday show. We welcome and applaud these new members.

We are happy to report that our youth mixed-gender chorus, The Recruits, directed by Eric Dalbey, also survived the pandemic, and will be competing in the International Chorus Contest in Charlotte, NC, this summer, as will the Ambassadors. We also look forward to our summer youth camp, Acappellooza, which will resume in June after two years of cancellation. We are truly excited about the coming year.



Project Harmony

For several years, AOH has been working with students in various St. Louis area schools to share our love of a cappella singing (primarily in the barbershop style) with students and teachers. Project Harmony takes contemporary a cappella music back to its roots by intergrating tight harmonies and barbershop singing techniques into a year-long program in local schools.

SCHOLARSHIP

Since 1997, the Ambassadors of Harmony have provided an annual college scholarship to local high school seniors. The \$1,000 scholarship is designed to encourage singers to continue pursuing vocal music education and is presented at AOH's annual concert in June.

RECRUITS

The Recruits chorus was formed in 2012 by AOH co-director Jonny Moroni to inspire, educate and provide choral opportunities for youth. Members benefit from performing before large audiences and receiving top-notch vocal instruction. In 2018, it welcomed new director, Eric Dalbey. In early 2019, the chorus became the first official BHS mixed chorus.



After careful review, we realized that the Foundation's by-laws needed to be updated. CHARLOTTE BARBERSHOP REUNION 2022 BHS INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION

On February 7, 2022, the Barbershop Harmony Society Board of Directors voted unanimously in a historic decision to open its annual international contest to all quartets and choruses, without gender distinctions. The vote followed more than eight months of engagement with members and barbershop leaders.

AOH and the Recruits are performing in the chorus competition at the 2022 BHS International Convention in Charlotte, NC. The chorus competition will take place on Friday, July 8th and Saturday, July 9th. The Recruits will compete on Friday. AOH will compete on Saturday morning. There will be 44 choruses competing.







